A nursing care plan (NCP) is a formal process that includes correctly identifying existing needs, as well as recognizing potential needs or risks. Care plans also provide a means of communication among nurses, their patients, and other healthcare providers to achieve health care outcomes.

The goal of a Restorative Nursing Care Plan is to ensure that a resident's

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abilities in activities of daily living do not diminish unless circumstances of the individual's clinical condition demonstrate that diminution was unavoidable.

Restorative Nursing Program for Long Term Care

Restorative Nursing Program (RNP) refers to nursing interventions that promote the resident's ability to adapt and adjust to living as independently and safely as possible. This concept actively focuses on achieving and maintaining optimal physical, mental, and psychosocial functioning.

Restorative Nursing Documentation

A few weeks prior to discharge from therapy, a restorative care plan is developed by the therapist. The therapist then trains restorative aids (RAs) to administer this plan. These RAs give care above and beyond the care of a CNA who is giving direct patient care for a group of residents.

Restorative Care • Focuses on :

- Establishing an individualized, goal oriented plan of care
- Improving mobility, physical functioning and Activities of Daily Living (ADL)
- Normalizing daily routines and activities
- Helping individuals “do for themselves”
