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### Prevention Of Myocardial Infarction

The possible methods of preventing myocardial infarction have been discussed. The desirability of prevention in the total problem of myocardial infarction is stressed. The methods consist of the prevention of the underlying coronary atherosclerosis, and the secondary prevention of myocardial ischemia contributed by other factors than those presumed to relate to atherosclerosis.

### Prevention of myocardial infarction - PubMed

Aspirin. The benefit of aspirin in the secondary prevention of MI is well established. In 791 patients who had MI reviewed by the Antiplatelet Trialists, low to medium doses of aspirin (75-325 mg/day) led to a 12 % reduction in deaths, a 31% reduction in reinfarction and a 42% reduction in non-fatal stroke.

Clotting in a peripheral vein is common among patients. When it occurs in thigh or pelvic veins pulmonary embolism may occur. The risk is higher in heart failure, with extensive infarction, or in patients with varicose veins. The risk should be reduced by early mobilisation and leg exercises.

### **Myocardial Infarction Treatment**

The ones used most commonly are clopidogrel ( Plavix, generic versions), prasugrel ( Effient) and ticagrelor ( Brilinta ). Reperfusion therapy can also be done with clot-dissolving drugs called thrombolytic agents, such as tissue plasminogen activator (tPA).

### **Heart Attack (Myocardial Infarction) Guide: Causes ...**

Myocardial ischemia, also called cardiac ischemia, reduces the heart muscle's ability to pump blood. A sudden, severe blockage of one of the heart's artery can lead to a heart attack. Myocardial ischemia might also cause serious abnormal heart rhythms. Treatment for myocardial ischemia involves improving blood flow to the heart muscle.

Randomized trials have shown that secondary prevention after acute myocardial infarction (AMI) reduces mortality and cardiovascular events, 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8 improves quality of life, and is generally considered cost-effective. 9, 10 Subsequent evidence-based guidelines have been developed, 11 and both payer and healthcare quality organizations require that secondary prevention metrics are met to receive payment and quality designations. 12, 13 Although various studies in "real ...

### **Cumulative Adherence to Secondary Prevention Guidelines ...**

Prevention of recurrent myocardial infarction and blood vessel thrombosis. 1 tablet of Cardiomagnyl containing ASA at a dose of 75 - 150 mg once a day. Prevention of thromboembolism after surgical interventions on vessels (coronary artery bypass grafting, percutaneous transluminal coronary angioplasty)
